TEMPORARY DETENTION ORDER

Defendant is charged by criminal complaint with passport fraud in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1542. The underlying case is pending in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Defendant was arrested in the Northern District of Texas.

An initial appearance was held on February 27, 2008 before U.S. Magistrate Judge Jeff Kaplan. Defendant appeared in person and through his retained counsel, William M. Ravkind and John H. Carney. Assistant U.S. Attorney Chad Meacham appeared for the government. At the initial appearance, the government moved to detain the defendant pending removal and thereafter until trial. Defendant requested a removal hearing, a preliminary hearing, and a detention hearing in the district of arrest, and asked for a continuance to prepare for these hearings. The court granted a continuance until March 3, 2008.


Accordingly, it is ORDERED that:

1. A removal hearing, preliminary hearing, and detention hearing are set for **March 3, 2008** at **2:00 p.m.** before U.S. Magistrate Judge Irma C. Ramirez, 1100 Commerce Street, 15th Floor, Dallas, Texas.

2. Defendant shall be detained without bond pending these hearings. The defendant is hereby committed to the custody of the Attorney General for confinement in an appropriate corrections facility separate, to the extent practicable, from persons awaiting or serving sentences or held in custody pending appeal. The United States Marshal shall produce the defendant in court as directed.

3. Defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to consult in private with his attorney.
